PLATFORM OVERVIEW

With the backing of Tiger Management, Morgan Creek launched its flagship hedged equity strategy in 2005. While Morgan Creek's Hedged Equity Platform began as a traditional manager-of-managers model, it gradually transitioned to a more direct investment strategy with the implementation of the Hybrid Model in 2013¹. We seek to partner with a select group of what we deem to be best-in-class managers around the world and actively co-invest in their highest conviction ideas including public equities and select later-stage private co-investments.

Manager Updates²

Hedge funds have largely performed in-line with their net exposure profiles thus far in October. According to data compiled by Morgan Stanley, U.S. focused long/short funds came into the week up ~1.5% vs. the S&P 500 Index at ~3.1%. On average, funds came into the month running 198% gross (94th percentile since '10) by 61% net (95th percentile since '10). It is worth noting that one positive driver of performance this month has been crowded longs, marking a sharp reversal of the trends we saw in the third quarter. As of October 15th, the top 50 crowded hedge fund long positions, as tracked by Morgan Stanley, had appreciated by ~3.7% for the month. We have also seen alpha generation on the other side of the book, as the top 50 short positions have appreciated ~2.0% (vs. ~3.1% for the S&P 500), resulting in a positive long/short spread of ~1.7%.

After a challenging third quarter, our managers have experienced broad-based outperformance in October, with positive factor contribution across both growth and value. As previously highlighted, we continue to see meaningful alpha generation opportunities within the Oil & Gas sector. Given this segment of the portfolio's recent outperformance, we thought it would be prudent to provide additional color heading into year-end. Valuations for oil exploration and production ("E&P") companies remain depressed, even after significant returns since late last year. Based on operating cash-flow multiples, our dedicated manager's E&P positions are currently trading at less than 50% of the average valuation over the last 20 years. Furthermore, at \$70 oil and relatively flat production, our manager's research suggests that many of the companies they own could privatize themselves in 3-5 years by purchasing their own shares at current prices with internally generated cash flow. Our conviction level in this theme remains high, and we continue to be excited about the return prospects of this segment of the portfolio heading into 2022.

DIRECT PORTFOLIO UPDATES³

appreciating nearly ~30% in October through yesterday's close.

It was recently reported by the Wall Street Journal that Chinese regulators suggested ride-hailing giant Didi Global (ticker: DIDI) and two other U.S.-listed tech firms explore listings in Hong Kong. The Cyberspace Administration of China, which in July started data security reviews into apps operated by the three companies, broached the idea in recent conversations with executives from DIDI, logistics platform Full Truck Alliance (ticker: YMM) and online recruitment firm Kanzhun (ticker: BZ). Having another listing in Hong Kong may mean any potential delisting from the U.S. market—either by choice or as a result of regulatory pressure—would be less disruptive to companies and their investors. A listing in Hong Kong could also potentially allow mainland Chinese investors to more easily invest and profit from the growth of these fast-expanding companies. U.S-listed firms like Alibaba (ticker: BABA) and Baidu (ticker: BIDU) have pursued Hong Kong share offerings in the past two years. It was also reported that authorities are expected to deliver their findings after the probes conclude which could be as soon as November. Investors thus far have reacted favorably to these reports, with DIDI's share price
